WHEREAS, The Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina (“Lumbee Tribe”) is a recognized American Indian Tribe of the State of North Carolina, subject to the Constitution of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina (“Tribal Constitution”) and its inherent powers and self-government, and;

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 1 of the Tribal Constitution delegates all legislative authority to the Tribal Council of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina (“Tribal Council”), and;

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council implements a Health Committee consisting of 7 council members to oversee the health and well-being of the Lumbee people, and to address all health disparities of tribal member.

WHEREAS, the above project will conduct community questionnaires with 100 tribal members regarding the barriers to eating healthy foods and physical activity as it relates to Diabetes.


WHEREAS, Marshirl Locklear, RN, BSN, MBA, a nursing student at Brenau University, located in Atlanta, Georgia, will conduct these surveys at two (2) local American Indian churches to include, Mt. Olive Pentecostal Church and Saddletree Church of God. At the conclusion of her completed questionnaires, she will summarize the findings to be included in her dissertation. This information will provide increased knowledge for health care professionals working Diabetes prevention and treatment.

WHEREAS, Marshirl Locklear, and all persons involved with the project agree to receive prior approval before any written report is disseminated to the public or research journal. And, all data will be given to the Lumbee Tribe to be used in future grant writing. Ms. Locklear will return at the conclusion of her study to report her findings.
