

## **The Lumbee Tribal Scholarship Award 2020**

Opens on February 28<sup>th</sup> and the deadline has been extended to April 27, 2020.

- 1. The Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina will be awarding scholarships to current college students enrolled for next semester and entering freshman. Applications will be competitive. Scholarships will be awarded to students attending a technical, two or four-year college, or university. The top three applicants will receive the Kernice Lee Locklear award in the amount of \$1000 and the remaining awards are in the amount of \$500.
- 2. The Lumbee Education and Cultural committee will weigh academic achievement, grade point average (minimum of 3.0), Native American cultural involvement, career plans, extracurricular activities, community involvement, and your essay for the award.
- 3. Applications must be received between February 28<sup>th</sup> through April 27<sup>th</sup> 2020.
- 4. Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19), we are accepting applications by mail only. Applications **must** be accompanied by an official transcript and <u>postmarked no later than April 27, 2020.</u> If you have any questions about the application, contact the current chairperson of the Education Committee.

- 5. Applicants must be tribally enrolled with active membership (a copy of tribal card must be included) or have at least one parent tribally enrolled with active membership (a copy of tribal card must be provided). Applicants must also have a parent's name if using parent's tribal enrollment number. Applicants must provide a tribal enrollment number on application and please provide a copy of the tribal card.
- 6. Applicants may apply annually.

- 3. A copy of a letter of admission/acceptance from a college or university or documentation of enrollment for the upcoming school year if currently enrolled.
- 4. A copy of the active Tribal Membership Card used for the application.
- 5. Application must be postmarked no later than April 27, 2020.
