ORDINANCE NO. 2003-008

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE LUMBEE TRIBE OF NORTH CAROLINA, that:

WHEREAS, The Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina, a recognized Indian Tribe of the State of North Carolina, subject to the Constitution of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina and its inherent powers of self-government; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina delegates all legislative authority to the Tribal Council; and


WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 2.c of the Constitution of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina delegates the Tribal Council the authority to enact an ordinance governing disqualification from Tribal Council office due to felony conviction,

THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Tribal Council of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina the following ordinance to be cited as an act regarding **“FELONY CONVICTION AND APPOINTED OFFICES WITH THE LUMBEE TRIBE”**:

No person with a felony conviction shall be allowed to serve in an elected or appointed position within the tribe.

CERTIFICATION

This Ordinance adopted this the 9th day of September 2003 at a duly called meeting of the Lumbee Tribal Council and, with a quorum present; this Council approved this Ordinance by a vote of twelve (12) for, and five (5) against.
