“JANUARY 18 TRIBAL DAY OF HISTORICAL RECOGNITION: VICTORY AT HAYES POND”

WHEREAS, The Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina (“Lumbee Tribe”) is a recognized American Indian Tribe of the State of North Carolina, subject to the Constitution of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina (“Tribal Constitution”) and its inherent powers of self-government;

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 1 of the Tribal Constitution delegates all legislative authority to the Tribal Council of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina (“Tribal Council”); and

WHEREAS, On January 18, 1958, members of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (KKK) scheduled a rally near Hayes Pond, south of Maxton, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Several hundred Lumbee, many of them armed, decided to put a stop to the KKK's activities in this area; and

WHEREAS, In an act of Tribal sovereignty and Tribal solidarity, the Lumbee confronted and routed the KKK, chasing them through the swamps surrounding Hayes Pond and out of Robeson County; and

WHEREAS, January 18, 2012 will mark the 54th anniversary of the victory over the KKK and the Battle of Hayes Pond; and

THEREFORE, Be it enacted by the Tribal Council of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina this ordinance that shall be cited as **“JANUARY 18 TRIBAL DAY OF HISTORICAL RECOGNITION: VICTORY AT HAYES POND.”**

THEREFORE, Be it further enacted, January 18 is, from this day forward, declared a Tribal Day of Historical Recognition in honor and memory of the Lumbee warriors who participated in the Battle of Hayes Pond, and shall be observed on an annual basis.

THEREFORE, Be it further enacted, this Tribal Day of Historical Recognition shall be known as “Victory at Hayes Pond.”

THEREFORE, Be it further enacted, the Lumbee Tribe shall compile a list of Lumbee participants in the Battle of Hayes Pond.


